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

Co-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES (CCA)

Provides a platform for students to:

- discover their talents and build self-confidence
- Take ownership with discipline and intent, nurturing self-leadership and purposeful growth
- Foster a culture of care

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Co-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES (CCA)

- Compulsory for all students to participate in at least one CCA.
- Students must be present at all trainings, meetings, and official activities (e.g. performances, camps). Any absence must be supported by a valid reason and covered by an MC or parents' letter (maximum of 3 per year).
- Attendance will affect LEAPS points and conduct grade



**VIA THEME:

- 1. Students choose 1-2 ICARE values.

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HOME-BASED LEARNING (HBL)

- Cultivates student autonomy
- Develops self-directed learning
- Build in students the discipline and ownership required to become lifelong learners
- Planning → Task Completion → Follow-Up (Back in school)

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HOME-BASED LEARNING (HBL)

- Subjects: Science, Mathematics, Mother Tongue, SIL Craft and Tech
- Instructions will be provided by subject teachers by the day before HBL
- HBL is just like any other school day; attendance will be taken in the morning. Students to notify FTs if unable to participate in HBL because of medical reasons or unforeseen circumstances.

STUDENT-INITIATED LEARNING (SIL)

- SIL is time set aside for students to learn beyond the formal curriculum and explore a specific subject area in more detail.
- Develop self-directed, independent, and lifelong learners who would go beyond the textbook to explore the world and derive a sense of fulfilment and deeper learning in the process.

HBL AND SIL: PARTNER WITH US

- Check in with your child/ward the evening before HBL to ask about their plan for HBL.
- Encourage and monitor your child/ward's engagement with and completion of HBL material and assignments
- Regularly discuss your child/ward's SIL activities and progress throughout the year

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ASSESSMENT @ TPSS

- Assessment is vital to both teaching and learning.
- Assessments help gauge students' understanding, highlight progress, surface areas for improvement, and inform our teaching strategies to support students' development and the achievement of learning goals.
- Cultivate discipline, build confidence and resilience to tackle increasingly complex academic challenges


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CONDUCIVE ENVIRONMENT
