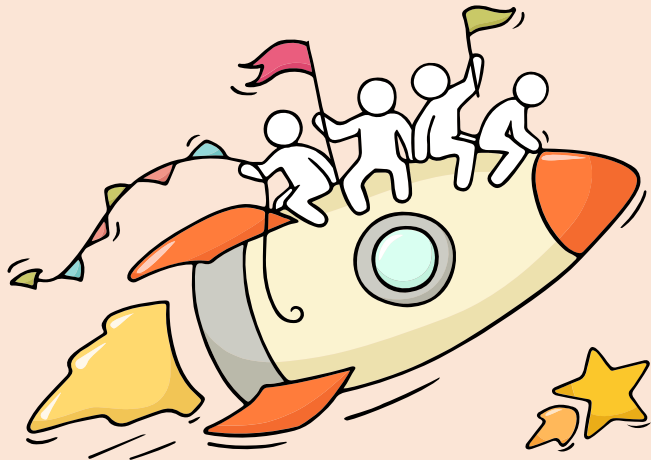

# Current Status of Class of 2025's 4E5NA in TPSS



63 of 164 students in 4E5NA (38.5%)  
secured admissions to EAE (Polytechnic) or DSA (JC).

## AFTER RESULT RELEASE

### Scenario #1

Student **successfully** secures EAE and is offered the EAE.

OR

### Scenario #2

Student **successfully** scores 20 points and below for L1R5 and hence secures DSA

When student opens the online form, they will be able to see **one sentence** stating that they have been offered their EAE course. They are **exempted from the JAE process and are not allowed to appeal for another course in Poly.**

**BUT...**

(1) What if they now want to try for JC?

-Accept EAE first

-Go to JC Directly and appeal to join using grades. Let go of EAE by e-mailing the Poly **ONLY AFTER** you receive an email proof from the JC saying that they are accepted.

When student opens the online form, they will be able to see **one sentence** stating that they have been offered their DSA(JC). They are **exempted from the JAE process.**

**BUT...**

(1) What if they now want to try for another JC?

-This is not recommended. They must directly contact the other JC and not go through the JAE process. They should **still proceed with the DSA offer in the meantime.**

# Current Status of Class of 2025's 4E5NA in TPSS



63 of 164 students in 4E5NA (38.5%)  
secured admissions to EAE (Polytechnic) or DSA (JC).

## AFTER RESULT RELEASE

### Scenario #3

Student is **unsuccessful** in EAE due to raw score for ELR2B2 being more than 26 points.

OR

### Scenario #4

Student scores 21 points and above for L1R5 and is **unsuccessful** in securing DSA

Student has to consider the following options:

- (1) Take part in JAE and apply for the 2-Year Higher Nitec Courses in ITE
- (2) Appeal to the Poly via email to reinstate them in the EAE course.
- (3) Take part in the DAE (Direct Admissions Exercise) to Poly. This is a 'backdoor'. They must still take part in JAE as a backup.

They must rank 12 choices in their JAE process.  
This can be a mix of Poly courses (ELR2B2).

If they are still interested in the A Level Pathway, they may want to consider Millennia Institute in Bukit Batok for the 3-year A Level Programme. This can also be one of the choices in their rank.

# JC Language Elective Programme (LEP)

- Students who are interested in the Junior College pathway (L1R5 must not exceed 20), are **able to deduct up to 4 bonus points** (up to **2 points for CCA** and **2 points for a pass in both** Higher Mother Tongue and English Language).
- However, if they wish to take up the Mother Tongue **Language Elective Programme** in JCs, they are able to **deduct a further 2 bonus points**. This means that a student can deduct up to 6 bonus points from their raw L1R5 score to gain admission to JC.

- Make a decision and take action based on your options.

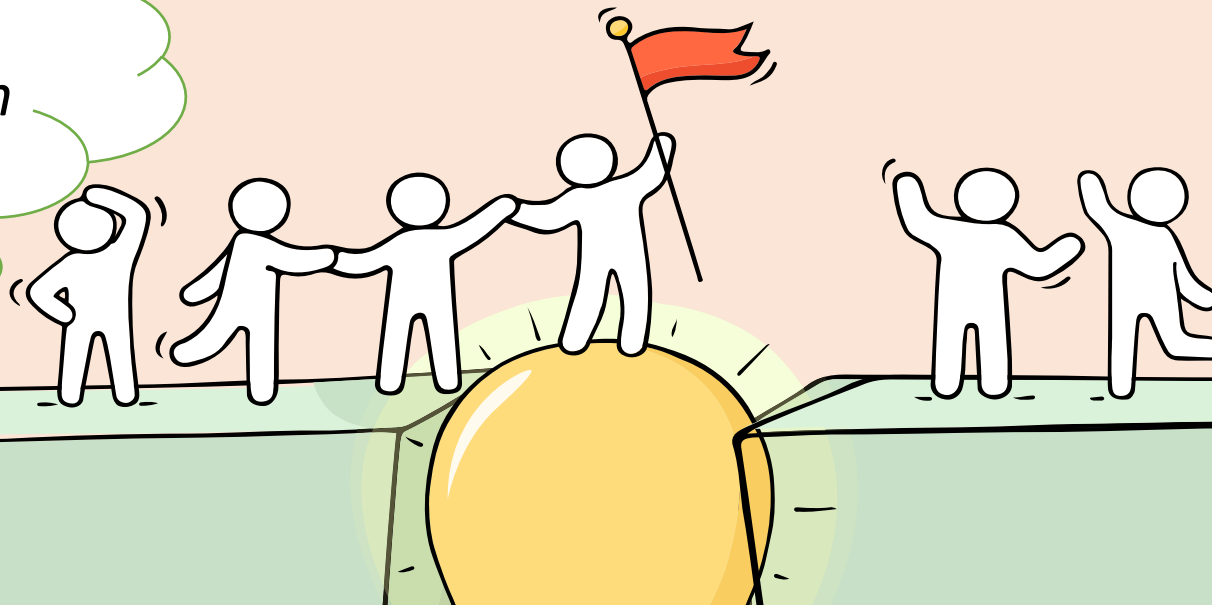
When you receive your results, you may experience a range of emotions.

# Guiding For Making The 12 Choices



## Passion Basket

### First 3 – 4 Choices

Consider courses that **most align** with your Values, Interests, Personality & Skills (V.I.P.S) and strengths.



## Practical Basket

### Next 4 Choices

Choose courses you are **interested in** and stand a **good chance in securing**. (where your net score is **within** the range of the last year's aggregate score).



## Prudence Basket

### Last 4 Choices

Include alternative courses and institutions where the latest aggregate scores are **higher** than yours. With this, your chances of securing a place will be higher.

- Must meet JC/MI entry requirements
- Application outcome will be provided by the JC/MI



## Polytechnic/ ITE/ Students NOT Posted to Any Course

- <https://jaeappeal.edu.sg/>
- Appeal application from **9.00am on 3 Feb 2026 (Tue) to 4.00pm on 6 Feb 2026 (Fri)**
- May submit up to six polytechnic diploma and/or ITE 2-year *Higher Nitec* courses, where:
  - Student has met the course minimum entry requirements, and
  - Student's net aggregate score is equal to or better than that of the lowest-ranked applicant posted to the course
- **At end of combined appeals period, all unposted students will be offered a place in a polytechnic or ITE course with remaining vacancies, subject to the aforesaid conditions**



# How will students know what to do?

- Candidates will receive a digital copy of Form A via their **registered email addresses** from 2.45pm **today, 14<sup>th</sup> Jan 2026**.
- BE SURE TO **CHECK YOUR JUNK OR SPAM FOLDERS** AS WELL.
- **Alternatively**, all candidates eligible for JAE can also download a copy of the Form A from the JAE-Internet System (JAE-IS) using Singpass during the application period.
- In the **unlikely event** that the student does not receive the Form A via email **and is unable** to log in to JAE-IS, please ask your FTs for your individual Form A and they will issue it to you.

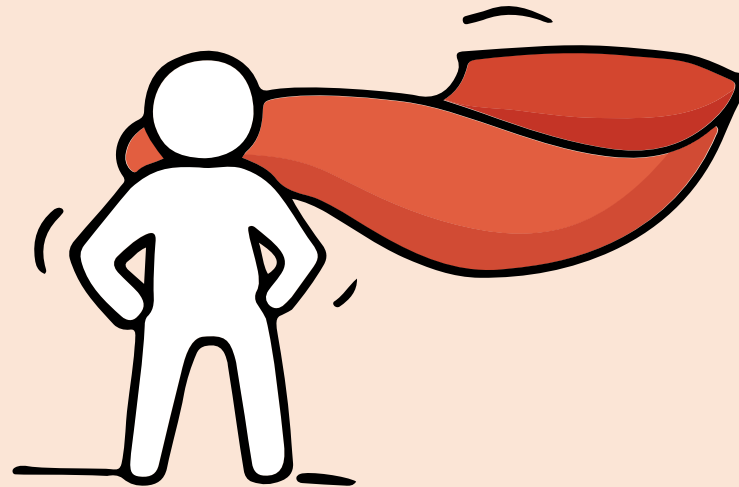

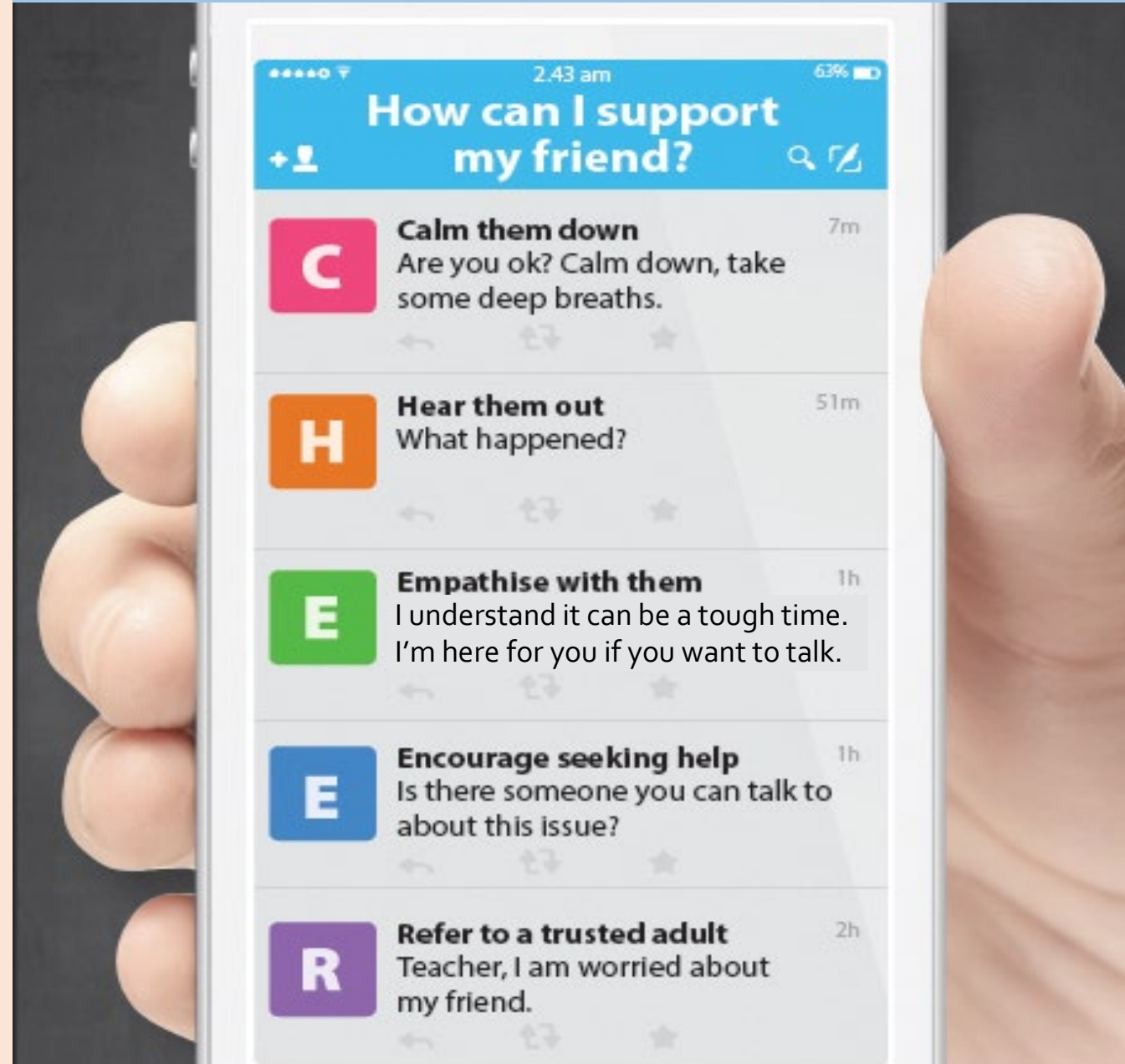

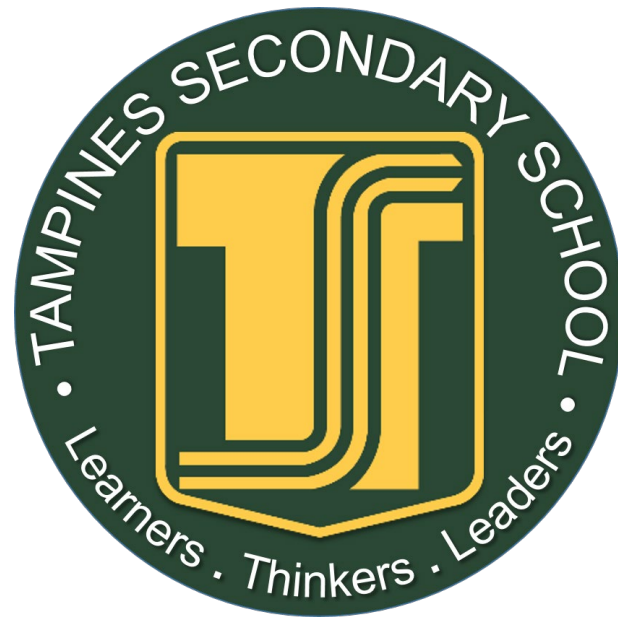
